

Max Dod's Memorial Ride and BBQ.

The day went well with exceptionally warm weather. It was good to have a ride out with clubmates after such a long while. Those on the bike ride were Alan Rowe, Mick & Debbie Valentine, Mick Jones and his friend Alistair, my Thanet clubmates Jenny and Terry Ferne and me.

Due to Alan and I not having ridden much in the past 18 months I decided that the ride would not be too strenuous by keeping the pace at no more than 12mph and a distance of 22 miles. We started by taking the cliff top path to Reculver, kindly provide at the expense of Sustrans, but sadly the 2 metre path has now reduced to half a metre, due to poor maintenance over the years. After a hairy descent into Reculver, we got back onto the tarmac and after a short climb descended onto the marshes through Chislet and Hoath. Then a couple of miles through the East Blean Woods, which forms part of the forestry which at one time completely surrounded Canterbury, and it fortunate that much of the woodland still remains.

On leaving the woods we unfortunately had to endure a mile or so of main road, but once the other side of the village of Herne we took to the lanes and on to Chestfield, where I led the group through the private estate, home to many celebrities over the years, including the late Charlie Chester.

We then made a short stop at my good friend Ken Larwood's house on the edge of the estate. Ken, another Thanet RC member (originally Marsh C. C. East London), was expected to come to the BBQ, but was not up to it. However, it was an opportunity for everyone to see his model railway, which takes up the whole of his garage and also some of his other models. On one of his models (now donated) Ken had painstakingly cut and placed 3.000 tiles on a roof of one of the buildings each tile was under 10cm.

Life on Skye

Hi everyone,

As in previous months – the latest update on the weather here. It seems quite strange of late, whilst the South has endured torrential rains and flooding we have enjoyed proper summer weather, in fact it has been shorts and tee shirt weather, topped off with sun hats and sun glasses. It has been so warm that the midges have refused to come out to play – that is a real bonus all round. Unfortunately we are sliding back to less welcome weather as from yesterday, with more to come today. Nice while it lasted.

I have remained busy in the garden, trying to tidy up following the tree surgeons work. They did warn me that the garden may well look like a war zone has hit, just for a short time, until new growth sets in – that is exactly how it is. The down side is the time span of 10 man days of work was insufficient and they will once again return in a couple of weeks to finish the job off. So more of the same to follow. I did think it was a bit ambitious the original guesstimate of time but I did not argue. I thought I had spectacular views from the house before they started but the views, have substantially increased. I have piles of loges sitting around awaiting shredding – a real bonus for me to have someone so local is useful as I already have a few mountains of shredding's awaiting the spreading action and could do without increasing my store. After phoning him he turned up just a few minutes later and removed one trailer load, promising to return with 'the boys' to continue the job in hand, with strict instructions of not to move any more of the logs myself, I am not arguing with that as some are rather large, in fact large enough to just line them up at the top of the driveway and roll them down to the collection point !! No point in getting older if you don't get wiser.

Now that a few offending conifers have been removed we have so much sunlight flooding in the house that Tony has resorted to wearing sunglasses inside, clearly he wants to get his money's worth from the purchasing outlay. Things are now looking even more promising.

We are continuing to get out and about as much as possible, in fact the local Alzheimer's link worker organised a small picnic in an enclosed garden in Portree last Friday. We went along. There was only 8 of us there plus two of the organising committee so it was quite good linking in with individuals all sharing common issues. Most interesting to speak with someone who really understands day to day living issues rather than plain sympathisers.

Despite many promises of some respite care for me from the Highland Council nothing has materialised yet so I am being patient. I realise that the pandemic is putting tremendous strain on all aspects of care which, unfortunately, is taking a back seat at the moment. In the meantime, during a casual conversation with a neighbour, she mentioned that she would be quite happy to sit with Tony for a couple of hours if I wanted the opportunity to go out for a walk. I acknowledge her kind offer and stored the information. He doesn't ,at this stage need caring, just really for my peace of mind of knowing that someone is there and he remains safe. I invited her down for a cup of tea and cakes yesterday afternoon for a trial run, so that she could meet Tony and he meet her and all appears good. During our conversations we spoke of many things but one item was pets.

My desire to either rehome a cat(s) or a dog seemed quite tame. I knew she had 4 rescue dogs as I had met all of them over the last few months., What I didn't know was that she also has a small aviary of exotic birds and – wait for it – a fully grown python snake. I find it strange that people have a need for such pets. This was also a rehomed 'specimen', at the bequest of her son, who has now moved away for work. I was pleased to know that Annie – the python- is kept in a secure tank and much admired by the family.

I am pleased to say that my neighbour has made the appointment to start visiting for a couple of hours in 4 days time. OK so long as the snake doesn't come as well.

The introduction of physiotherapy for Tony has come to an end after an 8 week session, so it is down to me entirely now. However the visiting physiotherapist feels he would gain from more attention and is recommending that a further session is organised, so it is a case of watch this space. Once Tony registered exactly who he was there was lots of chatting taking place between them whilst Anita and I caught up on girly conversations. A pleasurable visit all round. It was fortunate that they were holidaying in Scotland and decided to come across to Skye to catch up.

Kit update

Over the last few weeks we have been working with BioRacer to transfer our kit onto their online ordering system.

Because the kit is now digitally printed there is no need to do a bulk order and for the Club to hold stock. Individual items can be ordered and manufactured via the website on demand. It also means that the range of kit available is much broader. You will now be able to order from two different ranges, Professional and Race Proven. BioRacers Race Proven range as the name suggests is more aerodynamic with a closer fit and geared to racing. There will be a number of specific skin suits available, an aero suit, a time trial suit and a Cyclocross / MTB suit, as well as such delights as Speed Socks, trust me you will want a pair.

On the downside there will be a seven week lead time on orders so you will need to plan ahead. A few items like caps and neck warmers will need to be ordered in bulk and we will provide more detail about these items in due course.

As a club we receive a very good discount from BioRacer, in addition the Club is providing a very generous subsidy which makes this kit very good value for money. You will be able to apply the Club discount/ subsidy at the checkout on the site.

We had hoped to be able to launch this new system with the Newsletter but unfortunately its not quite ready. We will send out a separate email when it is and include an update in the next DLN. Once the BioRacer De Laune page is up and running you will be able to access the site via the clothing page on our website.
