# MOVING ON - PART 3

The third item that Maureen handed to me prior to her move to Christchurch was Alan's Olympic blazer sporting the Olympic badge on the breast pocket.

It was Alan's two years' National Service with the Royal Army Medical Corps that paved the way, not only to his success in the 1956 Olympic Games but also in the many other events he rode in during those two years.

It crossed my mind that the army may be interested in the blazer and I decided to contact the RAMC Museum at Ash Vale near Aldershot. The curator there said that they would be happy to accept the blazer and that it would be



displayed along with the racing vest of Sir Roger Bannister, who had also been a member of RAMC.

When I collected the blazer from Maureen she was concerned that it may be a little "dusty" as it had been hanging in her loft for some thirty or so years; however, it was perfectly clean but a little creased having been encased in a plastic cover - nothing that a little spruce-up at the local dry cleaners couldn't solve. They made a first-class job of smartening up the blazer and displayed it in the window of the shop for a few days, and also waived the cleaning charge!

The last time Alan's blazer was on show would have been at the clubroom in Choumert Road in 1988 when Ken Hill organised a display of club members' medals, cups and awards as a lead-up to the official opening of the clubroom the following year. I made an appointment at the RAMC Museum in Ash Vale and was met by one of the assistants to the Curator (who informed me that the museum's central heating system had broken down and, boy, was it cold in there!). I briefly explained the background to Alan's cycling career with the RAMC, supported by a photograph of Alan wearing the blazer, together with press cuttings and articles from Cycling magazine provided by Mark Ballamy.

I was about to comment to the young assistant that he probably wasn't interested in cycle racing when he informed me that his father raced for a Basingstoke club and, by coincidence, his name was Wiggins (no relation to Bradley!). He mentioned that it was a good time to have the blazer as in 2020 they were hoping to include an Olympic theme to some of the exhibits.

After an interesting tour of the museum, during which I spotted Sir





Roger's running vest amongst the various items, ranging from instruments for removing arrowheads from combatants at the Battle of Agincourt to more up-to-date equipment for dealing with the results (Improvised Explosive of IEDs Devices), I left for the warmth of my car with the heater at full blast and with a receipt for the blazer signed by D Wiggins!
