PRESIDENTS REPORT

The racing season is really upon us and riders have started to see the results of the winter training programme, such as Ian Sylvester, who rode the Kent Cycles Road Club 25 Time Trial and did a 1.03.03. Well done Ian.

As riders have started their season, there are fewer of us going out on the Club runs, but those who were there on the 1st March – John and Sarah Archdeacon, and James Cook (new member) had a terrific ride, from West Kingsdown to Bletchingly, Blindley Heath, did a left round to Hever, up Baileys Hill, through Ide Hill, down to Brasted, Pilgrims Way and finish by the Club Hill Climb (White Lane, Tatsfield). Sara and John had to ride home to Balham, James had to go to Dulwich – as for me, I had about a mile. We were out for about 3 hours, and it was a great ride and we really enjoyed it.

On Sunday 8th March we had another great Club Run, this time with Steve Valentine and James Cook, and we took a similar route to the week before, but we went up lde Hill this time. These runs go round a circuit so if anyone wants to do a shorter circuit they can meet up with us on any part of it.

I had my first Road Race on the 15^{th} , which was the Glendene at Thaxted, Essex. I was 3^{rd} in the over 70 category. A good race, and with the season under way, training is a little less hard. As for myself, all

the Club Runs since 16th December have been hard, because on Saturdays I have been doing power training, which made it, at the beginning, very hard to stay with the other riders on Sunday. As we have got nearer to the racing season, I've been getting stronger, and the power training is paying dividends. On Sunday 22nd at the new circuit at Hog Hill, I was 2nd in Age Group, and, better still, 5th in the overall race of 60 year olds and above. Dave Haggart has started racing, and his results (given elsewhere in the Mag) are encouraging. Keep your eyes on him!

On the 9th March at our Committee Meeting, the final touches were done to the new Club kit, which has been ordered. It really looks good, and all us "posers" should start from some time in May when we take delivery of the new kit, should take the opportunity to stand out from the crowd.

Good News: our next Committee Meeting will take place on Monday, 13th April, at the new venue – the Greyhound Public House in Dulwich Village. It promises to be a wonderful venue, as we are getting the room upstairs free of charge – but we need to spend some money behind the bar to make this work. Come along all of you, and take part in discussing the future of the Club (and have a great social at the same time). Here's looking forward to seeing you there.

This should be a good race to watch as it goes up Brenchley Hill nine times. The start is 9.30am .We have about 20 members out to help. Thanks guys.

Talking about members, did you know that we have had 25 individual members ordering the new De Laune racing kit? I did not think we had 25 members!!!

My Park & Ride for May (put in it your diary) will be the club run to France. The date will be Saturday the 16th May. I have managed to get some money from our committee to pay or part pay our boat fair. Please let me know if you want to go. Full details in the May DLN.
